

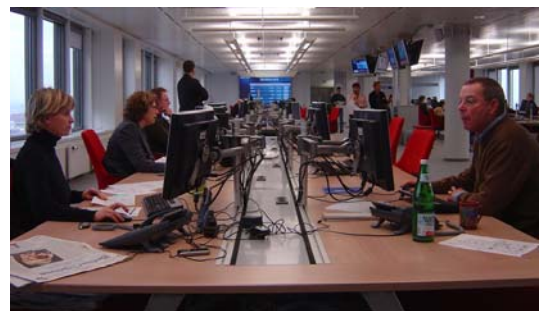

The most modern news editing department in Germany is to be found in the Axel Springer Verlag building. The newsroom that has been created is a marketplace for news, where staff work more than 18 hours a day, seven days a week. The purpose of the 400 square metre room is to enable the highest possible concentration of journalistic expertise in one place in order to enhance the quality and availability of information.

Everything comes together in the newsroom. At two long rows of tables, all the layout staff and envoys of all the departments sit. All the pages of the newspaper can thus be produced in a single room. The status of the current newspaper can be followed on the screen at the end of the room. This is where the "Berliner Morgenpost", "Die Welt" and the "Welt am Sonntag" newspapers are produced.
